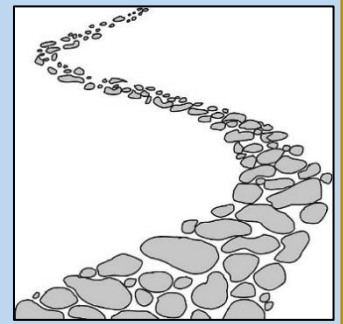

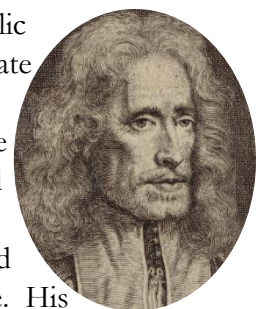
PRAYER OF ST RICHARD OF CHICHESTER

ST OLIVER PLUNKET (1625–1681)

St Oliver Plunket was the Catholic Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland. After anti-Catholic laws were relaxed in 1660, the archbishop moved to Ireland and established the first school in the country where Catholics and Protestants learned side by side. His ministry was an immediate success : in only 4 years he confirmed 48,000 Catholics. He became a victim of the anti-Catholic hate campaign of Titus Oates, the inventor the Popish Plot, who wanted to incite people against Catholics. 22 people, including Archbishop Plunket, were executed on false charges. Archbishop Plunket was beatified in 1920 and canonised in 1975.
