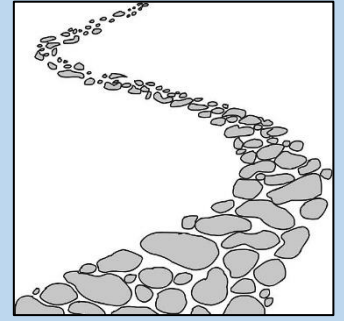


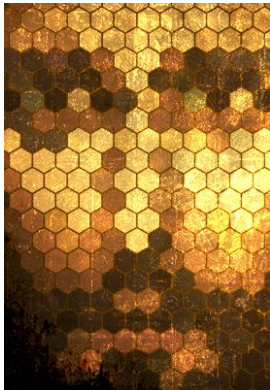

“YOU ARE ALL CHILDREN OF GOD.” (Galatians)



Theodore came from Tarsus in Turkey. A highly-educated monk living in Rome, he was consecrated Archbishop of Canterbury at the age of 65 in 668 AD. He was very energetic and travelled across England, settling disputes, founding churches, consecrating bishops, establishing schools and summoning councils.
